



Agriculture and Food Security Support

 Collaboration with FAO and WFP helped distribute agricultural inputs to over 43,718 farmers.

 Support spanned across Sierra Leone, Chad, Cameroon, and other West African nations to enhance food security.

Educational Support

• Since 1991, **136 schools** constructed across 12 countries, including Sierra Leone and Ghana

 Projects have improved clean water access, healthcare facilities, and educational infrastructure through partnerships like Peace Corps.

Back to School Support

• Since 2015, over **33,113 children** across countries like The Gambia and Chad have received back-to-school support.

 Focus on reducing school dropouts, life skills mentorship, and strengthening school management.

Back to School Support







 Supported 151 eye camps in 2023, with over 8,100 cataract surgeries performed.

• Since 2019, more than **6,700 cataract surgeries** completed annually across Sierra Leone, The Gambia, and other African nations.



















Water and Sanitation (WASH)

• In 2023, **105 drilling borehole water wells** were constructed across 11 countries.

 Since 2016, 273 wells have been built to provide clean drinking water to both schools and communities in West Africa

Mosque Constructions

• Since 2011, over **245 mosques** have been built in underprivileged Muslim communities.

• Countries include Sierra Leone, Togo, Burkina Faso, and the Central African Republic.

Ramadan Food Aid Distribution

- In 2023, over 222,500 people received Ramadan food parcels across Africa, targeting areas like Benin and Cameroon.
- More than 210,000 people benefited from the program since 2022.


Qurbani Meat Distribution
